TRANSIT SYSTEMS CAUGHT RED HANDED - ORDERED TO PAY BACK STOLEN WAGES

- ✓ **You took protected industrial action, turned off the opal machines.**
- ✗ **Transit Systems took your money, docking your wages by between 25 and 31 per cent.**
- ✓ **TWU took Transit Systems to Court who said Transit Systems had no right to take the money.**

MEMBERS WIN: Deputy President Easton in the Fair Work Commission found that Transit Systems' revenue was "unchanged" as a result of the drivers' action, and ordered that the drivers' pay instead be docked by just 1.5 per cent.



WAGE THEFT: Let's call this out for what it really is – a calculated attempt by Transit Systems to steal hundreds of thousands of dollars from its workers.

WHAT'S NEXT? TWU will talk to you about further action, which will include turning off Opal Machines! The union will continue to fight efforts by the company to remove the passenger service allowance when applying the ticket machine ban.
